Bristol City Council ECO4 Flexible Eligibility Statement of Intent

Local Authority name: Bristol City Council

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This statement sets out Bristol City Council's flexible eligibility criteria for the Energy Company Obligation (ECO4) scheme from April 2022 – March 2026.

The ECO4 scheme will focus on supporting low income and vulnerable households. The scheme will improve the least energy efficient homes helping to meet the Government's fuel poverty and net zero commitments.

The flexible approach for Local Authorities (LAs) to identifying fuel poor and vulnerable households who may benefit from heating and energy saving measures is referred to as "ECO4 Flex".

In Bristol, it is estimated that up to 68% of properties have an EPC rating of D or below. Increasing SAP ratings to band C, through the installation of energy efficiency measures, fits with the council's aims of addressing fuel poverty and reducing carbon emissions, specifically:

- <u>Our Corporate Strategy</u> tackle fuel poverty by improving home insulation, offer grants and loans to landlords and private home owners. This is measured using the key performance indicators (KPIs):
 - Fewer households in fuel poverty
 - Reduced carbon emissions across the city
- One City Plan setting out ambitious targets for the future of Bristol, decade by decade up to 2050. The collaborative plan that brings together public, private, voluntary and third sector partners in Bristol includes a range goals for tackling cold homes and fuel poverty.

• <u>Joint Strategic Needs Assessment</u> - chapter on Fuel Poverty provides an in-depth assessment of fuel poverty in Bristol, highlights the current services available to support fuel poor households and recommendations to the Health and Wellbeing Board for tackling fuel poverty.

Eligibility identification

The Council welcomes the introduction of the ECO4 Flex eligibility routes as it helps the Council achieve its plans to improve the homes of those in fuel poverty or vulnerable to the cold. The Council is publishing this Statement of Intent (SoI), on the **06/06/2023** to confirm that each of the households declared will adhere to at least one of the four available routes outlined below:

Route 1: SAP bands D-G owner-occupied households and private rented sector E-G households with an income less than £31,000. This cap applies irrespective of the property size, composition, or region.

Route 2: SAP bands E-G for owner-occupied households and private rented sector households that meet a combination of two of the following proxies:

Proxy 1) Homes in England in Lower-layer Super Output Area 1-3 (LSOA) ¹
Proxy 2) Householders receiving a Council Tax rebate (based on low income
only).
Proxy 3) Householders vulnerable to living in a cold home as identified in the
National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) Guidance. Only one from
the list can be used, excludes the proxy 'low income'.
Proxy 4) A householder receiving free school meals due to low-income.
Proxy 5) A householder supported by a LA run scheme, that has been named and
described by the LA as supporting low income and vulnerable households for the
purposes of NICE Guideline. **Please note Proxy 5 is not in use currently**
Proxy 6) A household referred to the LA for support by their energy supplier or
Citizen's Advice or Citizen's Advice Scotland, because they have been identified as
struggling to pay their electricity and gas bills.

Route 3: SAP bands D-G owner-occupied households and private rented sector E-G households that have been identified by their doctor or GP as low-income and vulnerable, with an occupant whose health conditions may be impacted further by living in a cold home. These health conditions may be cardiovascular, respiratory, immunosuppressed, or limited mobility related.

This is because the Council has identified a positive correlation between households who suffer from long-term health conditions and living off a low-income, with living in poorly insulated homes.

Route 4: SAP band D-G owner-occupied households and private rented sector E-G households that are referred under Route 4: Bespoke Targeting. Suppliers and LAs can submit an application to BEIS where they have identified a low income and vulnerable household, who are not already eligible under the exiting routes.

Declaration and evidence check confirmation

All potentially eligible households will need to apply for ECO Flex through the Home Energy Team at the Centre for Sustainable Energy. There is an administration fee for each measure being proposed on each ECO Flex declaration (to be paid by the installer or energy supplier installing the measure).

If you are an installer or managing agent and you wish to process ECO Flex declarations then you will need to contact the Centre for Sustainable Energy and sign their Code of Conduct (contact installers@cse.org.uk for more information). They will then process the applications in line with the BEIS guidance including contacting the household to check their eligibility and then preparing the declarations for sign-off. The information will be passed to their ECO supplier according to the ECO application process.

Householders who believe they may be eligible for ECO Flex should contact the Home Energy Team directly (0800 082 2234 or https://www.cse.org.uk/advice/contact-us). The Home Energy Team provides impartial energy advice to residents of Bristol and will check ECO Flex eligibility in their initial conversation with the resident. They will also check that the resident is happy for their data to be stored and shared with a third party for the purposes of the scheme. The eligibility information will be recorded on a secure CRM. A referral will then be made to an obligated supplier or installer who has signed the Code of Conduct.
