Draft tree planting plan for Plummers Hill Open Space

November 2023

A draft tree planting plan was circulated to residents and displayed in locations on the street. In addition, it was added to the consultation page on the Bristol City Council website.

We have responded to the comments as received below with more detail as a point of record.

What happens next?

The tree planting plan for Plummers Hill will be kept as a potential site for future tree planting – tree planting will not take place this winter.

Comments received: We have given these comments consideration and provide responses below:

Could the current pathway in this area remain?	Yes, all current desire lines will be left for park users.
What species will be planted?	We have proposed to plant native, woodland species such as Hazel, Hawthorn, and Crab Apple. We will mainly be planting scrub species to reduce impact on residential views.
The park has experience vandalism in recent years, the trees would fair better if they were larger and well protected.	We are aware of the situation; steps have been taken to help improve the existing trees at Plummers Hill. On-going monitoring will be carried out.
Can we volunteer to help plant the trees?	Yes, planting dates will be advertised on our website. Contact otpc@bristol.gov.uk if you would like to attend a planting session.
