


The Times Digital Archive is a full-image online archive of every page published by The Times [London] from 1785-1985. The text within the images is fully searchable at the article level. Users can easily search news articles, obituaries, advertising and classifieds. Results are displayed at the article level and users may view the article — or the full page upon which it appears.

Example Searches

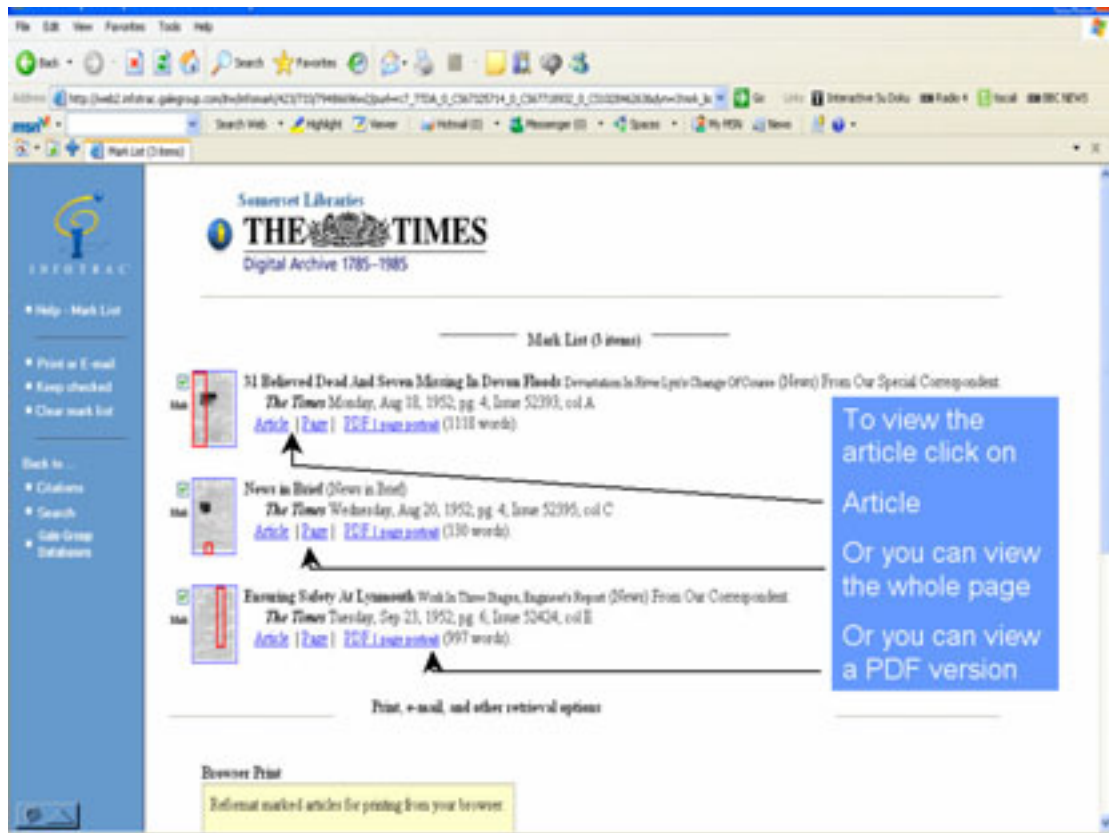
I am looking for information on the Lynmouth Flood

Type in **Lynmouth flood** in the search box. You can set limits using date and/or section.

Click on E mail or retrieval on the left of the screen
