This is a submission from the Hengrove and Whitchurch Park Neighbourhood Planning Forum, made on their behalf by LB Planning.

We are firstly submitting some additional evidence regarding Policy HWP6, Sites of Local Wildlife Interest. Please find attached:

- A report on the Hawkfield former Tennis Court site, plus photo appendices;
- A report on the Malago plus map, which includes consideration of the Pigeon House Stream site in this Plan.

There are no formal surveys of the area of Brislington Brook, but the Friends of Brislington Brook Website shows a range of events and local support for the wildlife found along its route. As the website states (<https://friendsofbrislingtonbrook.wordpress.com/brislington-brook/>):

“Brislington Brook.

We are so lucky in Bristol that at the end of the last ice age the sea level was 150 feet, that is 50 metres, lower than it is now. The result is that even very small streams run through very deep valleys, and Brislington Brook is no exception. Steep sides are hard to cultivate, and difficult to build on, so as Bristol expanded the developers usually left them alone. Brislington Brook rises in Hengrove Park, cuts through the village below the church, and then starts to fall”

We have applied to the Conservation Section of Bristol City Council to have the former runway on Hengrove Park listed as a local historic asset (acknowledging that some alteration to it may be needed). We have heard no more about this, so do not know how the request is proceeding. Attached is the justification we submitted for the designation in March 2018. This is further evidence for the designation of the re-modelled Hengrove Park as a Local Green Space.
