Community Consultation: Woodland tree planting in Merrimans Drive open space

This is a draft tree planting plan for Merrimans Drive open space which includes approx. 2000 new native woodland trees. We are now undertaking a community consultation, please refer to our map. Maps can also be viewed at www.bristol.gov.uk/onetreeperchild

Local primary school children will help with the tree planting this winter on completion of the consultation - all planting is subject to community feedback and underground service checks.

Trees are great for Bristol!

Environment: Trees act as full-time air filters, cleaning our city air

Road safety: Tree-lined streets improve the attention of drivers, so they drive slower!

Wildlife: Trees provide food and shelter to wildlife, bringing nature to our doorsteps

Wellbeing: Trees make us feel more relaxed and add character to our neighbourhoods

Economy: Property values are higher in tree-lined streets than those with no trees

Bristol City Council design tree planting schemes with “the right tree in the right place” principle, carefully considering each tree planting location and appropriate tree species.
