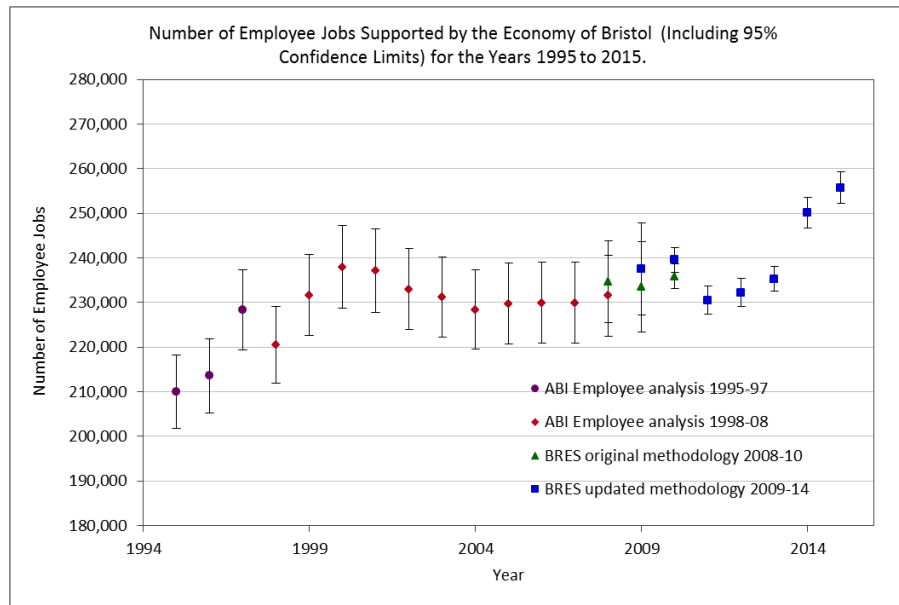


Employee Jobs (Workplace) in Bristol since 1995 – November 2016

The chart below shows the number of employee jobs¹ supported by the economy of Bristol for the 20 year period starting in 1995. Also shown are the 95% confidence limits².



Clearly the number of employee jobs supported by the economy of Bristol increased significantly (13.3%) between 1995 and 2000 and then there was no significant increase or decrease³ between 2000 and 2013.

Post recession (2008) improvements in the survey errors (95% conf limits) reveal a more detailed picture⁴. The number of employee jobs in Bristol fell significantly (3.8%) between 2010 and 2011; remained unchanged between 2011 and 2013 and then increased significantly (8.7%) between 2013 and 2015.

As of 2015 the economy of Bristol supported about 255,700 employee jobs, up 10.9% on the minimum⁵ (230,500) of 2011 and 11.1% on the average (230,100) for the 5 years prior to the 2008 recession (2003 to 2007). In 2015 the number of employee jobs in Bristol was 21.8% above the level of 1995 (210,000).

⁴ but note that even if the 95% conf limits for the data that cover the period 1998 to 2008 were the same as those post 2008 there would still have been "no significant change between 2000 and 2013"
