



## Summary of public comments on draft tree planting plan for

### Lodge Hill Open Space

October 2021



A draft tree planting plan was circulated to immediate neighbours and posted in numerous locations around the open space. Thank you to everyone for taking the time to comment. Below is a summary of the comments and enquiries received; Bristol City Council's response; and any minor revisions to the plan if appropriate.

#### Areas of concern raised:

We have given these concerns consideration and provide our responses with any action below.

#### Issue:

1. Three comments received were concerned that large, mature trees would block the view
2. Two comments stated that the area is well used by children for sledging in the winter months

#### Bristol city council response:

1. Smaller, shrub species will be planted to reduce the impact on the view such as Rowan, Dogwood, Hazle and Guelder-rose
2. Planting plan amended to take into account the comments received
