

CITY OF BRISTOL

(VARIOUS ROADS, ROMNEY AVENUE AREA, LOCKLEAZE WARD, CITY OF BRISTOL) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING) (LOADING PLACES) ORDER 20--

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE that it proposes to make a traffic order, the effect of which would be:-

1. to introduce prohibition of waiting arrangements for vehicles in lengths of **Borough Park, Copley Gardens, Cotman Walk, Crome Road, Crowther Park, Crowther Road, Downman Road, Elmcroft Crescent, Elmcroft Crescent (unnamed access), Fairacre Close, Gilray Close, Haydon Gardens, Hogarth Walk, Landseer Avenue, Lindsay Road, Morris Road, Muller Road, Mulready Close, Nevinson Place, Orpen Gardens, Rackham Close, Rear access Elmcroft Crescent, Rossetti Way, Shaldon Road, Sir Johns Lane, Stanfield Close, The Gaskins and Turner Gardens;**
2. to revise prohibition of waiting arrangements for vehicles in lengths of **Bonnington Walk, Brangwyn Grove, Cameron Walk, Constable Road, Gainsborough Square and Romney Avenue;**
3. to retain restriction of waiting arrangements for vehicles in lengths of **Gainsborough Square;**
4. to introduce prohibition of loading/unloading provision on-site for vehicles in lengths of **Bonnington Walk and Gainsborough Square;**
5. to retain loading/unloading restriction for vehicles in a length of **Gainsborough Square;**
6. to retain no stopping prohibition on school entrance markings in **Brangwyn Grove and Romney Avenue;** and
7. to retain loading places in **Gainsborough Square.**

Opportunity would also be taken to correct anomalies between the provisions of the existing traffic order and on-site road markings/signs relating to prohibition of waiting in **Borough Park, Cameron Walk, Gainsborough Square and Romney Avenue.**
