

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR CRIME AND POLICING ACT 2014
SECTION 59
PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDER 2020
ST PAUL'S – INCLUDING PORTLAND SQUARE

BRISTOL CITY COUNCIL (the Council) in exercise of its powers under section 59 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014 (the Act), being satisfied that the conditions set out in section 59 of the Act have been met, including that the anti-social behaviour arising from consumption of alcohol in the Restricted Area has had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality, made a Public Spaces Protection Order on 20 October 2017.

The Order has been extended in accordance with section 60 of the Act because the Council is satisfied on reasonable grounds that doing so is necessary to prevent (a) occurrence or recurrence of the activities identified in the order, or (b) an increase in the frequency or seriousness of those activities.

1. This Order applies to the public space known as St Paul's, including Portland Square, delineated in dashed red on the plan annexed to this Order (the Restricted Area):
 - a. No person in the Restricted Area shall be in possession of any opened or unsealed bottle or container of alcohol.
2. Any person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with the requirement of a constable or authorised person not to consume alcohol or anything they reasonably believe to be alcohol; or to surrender anything which the constable or authorised person reasonably believes to be alcohol or a container of alcohol commits an offence and shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.
3. A Fixed Penalty Notice may be issued to a person who a constable or authorised person has reason to believe has committed an offence in relation to this Order, offering the person to whom it is issued the opportunity of discharging any liability to conviction for the offence by payment of a fixed penalty.
4. If any interested person desires to question the validity of this Order on the grounds that the Council had no power to make it or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with in relation to this Order, he or she may apply to the High Court within 6 weeks from the date on which this Order is made.
5. The Order as extended shall come into operation on 19 October 2020 and shall remain in place for a period of 3 years.

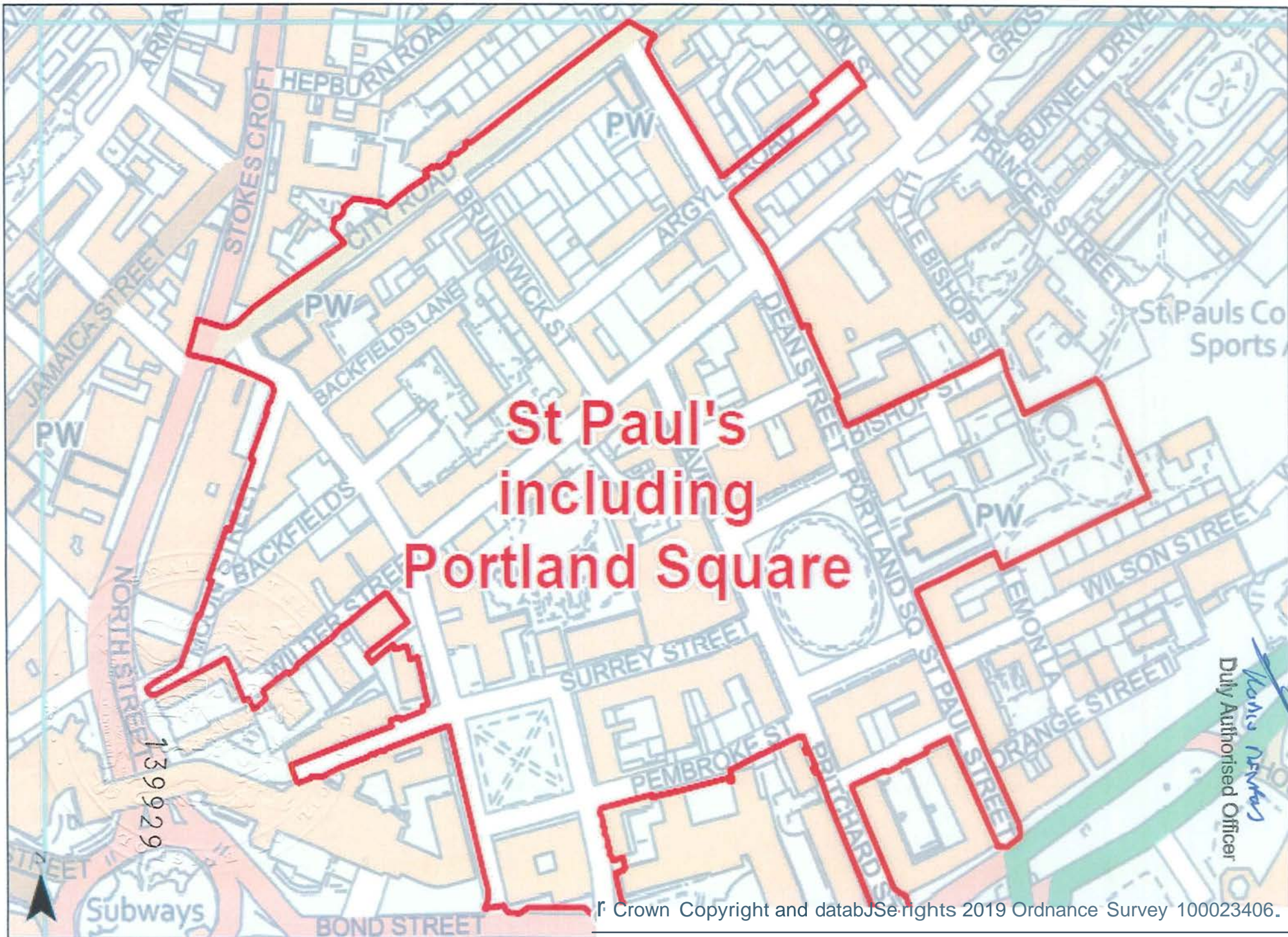
