



## Summary of public comments on draft tree planting plan for

### Elderberry Walk Open Space

September 2021

#### Bristol city council response:

1. Maintenance will be carried out by the OTPC volunteer team. Tree maintenance sessions run throughout the year outside of the planting season
2. We will plant the trees in suitable locations, away from residential properties, maintaining existing sight and desire lines
3. The wood pasture trees will be a mix such as Oak, Lime, Field Maple, and Sweet Chestnut. We are hoping to plant no more than 20 wood pasture trees in this area
