



Summary of public comments on draft tree planting plan for

Lockleaze Open Space

September 2021



A draft tree planting plan was circulated to immediate neighbours and posted in numerous locations around the open space. Thank you to everyone for taking the time to comment. Below is a summary of the comments and enquiries received; Bristol City Council's response; and any minor revisions to the plan if appropriate.

Areas of concern raised:

We have given these concerns consideration and provide our responses with any action below.

Comments:

1. Due to there being a well-used path in this area, perhaps this is not the right location for dense planting?

Bristol city council response:

1. We will retain the pathway by planting either side allowing access to remain

Tree plan revisions:

In addition to the main concern above, we received five additional comments. These do not affect the final tree plan, see below:

Comments:

1. Four positive comments were received about the planting proposal
2. Romney Avenue is no longer a tree lined street

Bristol city council response:

1. It's fantastic to have so many positive responses to the consultation. We are looking forward to creating a beautiful new woodland on the site
2. I will look into whether new street trees are appropriate for this area

What happens next?

Planting will take place during the winter planting season between November 2021- March 2022.
