



Summary of public comments on draft tree planting plan for

Purdown Open Space

September 2021



A draft tree planting plan was circulated to immediate neighbours and posted in numerous locations around the open space. Thank you to everyone for taking the time to comment. Below is a summary of the comments and enquiries received; Bristol City Council's response; and any minor revisions to the plan if appropriate.

Areas of concern raised:

We have given these concerns consideration and provide our responses with any action below.

Comments:

1. Access required for grass cutting
2. Three comments received were concerned that the historical and amenity value would be lost if trees were planted
3. What is the planting density? Could trees some of the trees get planted elsewhere?

Bristol city council response:

1. Access will be maintained
2. We have revised the planting plan to take into account the comments. The new plan incorporates a larger design. Funding permitting, planting will be carried out over the next two years
3. Woodland trees are planted at 2m apart. Yes, please see revised plan
