



Summary of public comments on draft tree planting plan for

Mancroft Park

September 2021



A draft tree planting plan was circulated to immediate neighbours and posted in numerous locations around the open space. Thank you to everyone for taking the time to comment. Below is a summary of the comments and enquiries received; Bristol City Council's response; and any minor revisions to the plan if appropriate.

Areas of concern raised:

We have given these concerns consideration and provide our responses with any action below.

Comments:

1. One comment received was concerned that the trees will be vandalised
2. Will the trees be saplings?
3. Will the trees be maintained?

Bristol city council response:

1. We currently plant all woodland trees with spiral guards. These make the trees visible and potentially vulnerable. In this case, we may not use spiral guards to help prevent vandalism
2. Yes, all trees planted in this area will be saplings. They will be planted at 2m apart, species mix to include Hawthorn, Oak, Spindle, Hazel and Blackthorn.

3. OTPC run volunteer sessions every week throughout the year. Trees planted by OTPC will be maintained outside of the planting season by our volunteer team
