

Summary of public comments on draft tree planting plan for

CANA COURS

Little Cross House

November 2021

A draft tree planting plan was circulated to immediate neighbours and posted in numerous locations around the open space. Thank you to everyone for taking the time to comment. Below is a summary of the comments and enquiries received; Bristol City Council's response; and any minor revisions to the plan if appropriate.

Areas of concern raised:

We have given these concerns consideration and provide our responses with any action below.

Comments:

- 1. Concerns raised regarding the tree maintenance.
- 2. What species will be planted?
- 3. How tall will the trees grow?
- 4. The area is not accessible for all.
- 5. Other trees that have been planted in the area have died.

Bristol city council response:

- 1. OTPC run volunteer sessions every week throughout the year. Trees planted by OTPC will be maintained outside of the planting season by our volunteer group.
- 2. We have selected Hawthorn for this area. Hawthorn is a great species for wildlife as well as proving colour and interest in the spring and autumn months.
- 3. The proposed planting is a hedgerow. They final height can be agreed/amended by those concerned.

- 4. Although this area may not be accessible for all, tree planting is taking place across the city in various locations that can be accessible and enjoyed by everyone.
- 5. I will assess the recent, standard tree planting on site and liaise with the area Tree Officer.
