Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Development Plan - Consultation on submitted plan

I am writing to inform you that the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Development Plan has been formally submitted to Bristol City Council by the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Planning Group and to invite you to make comments on the document on behalf of the council.

Neighbourhood Development Plans are planning policy documents prepared by local communities. Before the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Development Plan can become a statutory planning document, it must be published for consultation and passed to an independent examiner for scrutiny. If successful at examination, the Neighbourhood Development Plan will proceed to a local referendum to decide whether it should become part of the development plan for Bristol and be used alongside the Bristol Local Plan to determine planning applications in Lawrence Weston.

The local community and stakeholders have already been involved in the preparation of the plan, but there is now a further opportunity for you to comment and have your views passed to the examiner for consideration.

Representations can be made for a six-week period from Friday 6th May 2016 to Friday 17th June 2016. Please be aware that all representations will be publicly available.

The deadline for representations is **Friday 17th June 2016**. Representations should be sent:

I am writing to lend my support to the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Development Plan.

Lawrence Weston is in real need of new retail offerings and I am delighted to see that provision has been made for a 1,800m² convenience food store to increase competition, and also to entice increased footfall to Rodingleaze shops.

The commitment to a new community hub is of course to be welcomed. I am fully aware of all the hard work that has gone into making this a real prospect, with the inclusion of a medical centre, library and employment and voluntary services support.

Whilst the establishment of the new SevernNet bus is a real step forward, I am aware public transport still remains an issue, and steps to improve the transport system to increase access to employment and other destinations has rightly been made a priority.
