Thank you for sharing the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Development Plan and allowing us to make comments on the document.

I have reviewed it with my colleague and we just have a few grammatical comments;

- Para 3.11 - 1st sentence is missing a word. I think it is supposed to read 'There is a lack of safe cycle route and low take up of cycling on the estate. Residents are dependent on their cars, though car ownership is low as 39% have no van/car'
- Para 4.2 - Date should read 2013 not 20133.
- Para 10.1 - Version number not included. 'Please see the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Development Plan 2016 Submission Version XXX and the'....
- Para 11.8.3 - 1st word of the final bullet point is missing a letter. Should read Increase (currently ncrease).
- Para 16.2.4 refers to Map 12 but this hasn't been included in the document.

It looks like a very exciting plan with lots of positive changes over the next few years.

I am writing to inform you that the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Development Plan has been formally submitted to Bristol City Council by the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Planning Group and to invite you to make comments on the document on behalf of the council.

Neighbourhood Development Plans are planning policy documents prepared by local communities. Before the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Development Plan can become a statutory planning document, it must be published for consultation and passed to an independent examiner for scrutiny. If successful at examination, the Neighbourhood Development Plan will proceed to a local referendum to decide whether it should become part of the development plan for Bristol and be used alongside the Bristol Local Plan to determine planning applications in Lawrence Weston.

The local community and stakeholders have already been involved in the preparation of the plan, but there is now a further opportunity for you to comment and have your views passed to the examiner for consideration.

Representations can be made for a six-week period from Friday 6th May 2016 to Friday 17th June 2016. Please be aware that all representations will be publicly available.

The deadline for representations is **Friday 17th June 2016**. Representations should be sent:
