Lesson Aims	Today we are going to - taken from the PSHE Association Curriculum Framework 2014 (updated 2017)  • Understand that social media relationships may not reflect real life and the possible impact of this on people's expectations of relationships
Advantages And Disadvantages Of Social Media Communication	True Identity, identity is only true if recognised by others  Class Discussion:  What are some advantages and disadvantages of being on and using social media to communicate?  Class feedback and discussion – use examples for comparison  Teacher to record feedback
Decoding Profiles	Decoding Profiles, no verbal or social clues to help us, what message are we sending out  People are not going to include things in their profile, understanding that people can hide their real self  In Groups of 4:  Discuss and make a list of some of the reasons why people's online profile may not accurately reflect themselves  Share them with the class  Feedback and Class discussion – use examples for comparison

	<ul> <li>Review the photos and friend request in the Facebook Images</li> <li>What are you first impressions of the people when you look at each of</li> </ul>
	them?
	- How do they make you feel about your life?  What questions would you ask if they want to become your friend and
	<ul> <li>What questions would you ask if they want to become your friend and you were checking to see if they were real?</li> </ul>
	<ul><li>What would you do if you found out they were lying?</li></ul>
