



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION
ACT 1984
SECTION 23 PEDESTRIAN CROSSING



NOTICE is hereby given that the City Council of Bristol in exercise of powers conferred by section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, and after consultation with the chief officer of police, intends to:-

1. Amend the following uncontrolled (zebra) crossing in the City of Bristol:-

<u>Location</u>	<u>No. of Crossings</u>
Across Avonvale Road (Easton and Lawrence Hill wards) between its junctions with Beam Street and Mildred Street.	1 (zebra)

This amendment solely extends the zigzag markings to the west of the existing crossing; the position of the crossing itself is not changing.
