

Privacy Notice: Economic Development Service

Bristol City Council is the data controller for the purposes of the Data Protection Act 2018 and other regulations including the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR), which means it determines what your personal data is used for and why it is collected.

The purpose of this privacy notice is to tell you about how we collect and use personal data in connection with our service. The information here should be read in conjunction with the Council's corporate privacy notice: <u>Privacy (bristol.gov.uk)</u>. We may update this privacy notice from time to time. When we do this, we will communicate any changes to you and publish the revised privacy notice on our website.

What council services are covered by this privacy notice?

Business Improvement Districts/Business Rates

The Economic Development Team plays a key coordinating role in the development of Business Improvement Districts (BIDs) in Bristol, necessitating the holding of data (itself drawn from BCC Business Rates data) to conduct formal ballots of businesses which fall into specific geographical areas that may or may not become BIDs, depending on the outcome of a ballot.

Business Newsletter

The information provided enables the Council to inform local businesses of information that can support and aid their business, e.g., business rate relief, business grants.

Invest Bristol and Bath (IBB)

To assist with locating business in Bristol; assist with sourcing commercial property. Information is held with Joint Controller <u>Invest Bristol & Bath - Home (bristolandbath.co.uk)</u>

Bristol Business and Enterprise Support (BrisBES)

The programme involves the provision of enterprise coaching, advice and support and grant schemes which promote both private and social enterprise models and work in partnership with intermediary / community-based organisations to target socio-economically disadvantaged communities across the target wards in Bristol.

Bristol Nights

Bristol Nights is a partnership project from Bristol City Council. Its purpose is to support the Bristol city at night including businesses that are open and people working from 6pm-6am.

Provides support to Bristol Market traders.

Living Wage City

How will this service use your personal data?

Business Improvement Districts/Business Rates

• Data provided by the business is provided for the sole purpose of developing Business Improvement Districts (BIDs).

Business Newsletter

- Data provided by the business is only used to send subscribers business news emails. The data is not shared anywhere else and businesses are able to unsubscribe from emails using the unsubscribe link at the bottom of the email.
- Our legitimate interests are to provide regular business emails which include comprehensive business news, updates, and information.

Invest Bristol and Bath (IBB)

• The information provided enables the Council to inform regional, national and international businesses of information that can support the businesses in locating to the Bristol area.



- Businesses provide contact details as the have expressed an interest in Investing in the region.
- The Invest in Bristol and Bath initiative was set up specifically to attract businesses to the region. Please see website: <u>Invest Bristol & Bath Home (bristolandbath.co.uk)</u>
- Businesses have willingly provided their details to the Invest in Bristol and Bath team initiative.
- Businesses can approach individual Local authorities or business networking groups if they wish, but registering with this initiative provides easy access to the relevant contacts.

In the following circumstances you are required by law or contract to provide personal information.

Our legitimate interests

- To assist with locating business in Bristol; assist with sourcing commercial property.
- Investment in city could provide benefit to wider community for example job vacancies and wider investment in Bristol.
- Important for further development of city, investment in local economy and to retain skilled workers within the city.
- No specified impact will occur if business does not locate to city.
- Data would not be used in an unethical or harmful way.

Bristol Business and Enterprise Support (BrisBES)

• The data will enable the correct provision of enterprise coaching, advice and support and grant schemes which promote both private and social enterprise models and work in partnership with intermediary / community-based organisations to target socio-economically disadvantaged communities across the target wards in Bristol.

Bristol Nights

Bristol City Council will use your personal information to process your eligibility for the provision of services, training and support from the Bristol Nights function and service partners to:

• Help Businesses operating between 6pm-6am in the city of Bristol to access business support and training to enable them to operate safely, securely and efficiently during those hours.



- Help individuals working in the city of Bristol between 6pm-6am to access training, support and guidance to work safely and understand their rights.
- Help individuals visiting the city of Bristol during 6pm-6am to provide them with guidance of where to go and what is available and doing so safely.

High Streets

- Personal data is collected and processed to help pre-start, start-up, sole traders and SMEs (including VCSE) whose business is based within a designated high street or within the city centre (or for pre-starts who will be based in one of these areas) start, grow or sustain their business.
- The information is also used to identity other types of support that maybe relevant to the business and inform the business about the support that they may be able to access.
- Data is only used for the purpose of the programme and onward referral to appropriate support providers such as the Combined Authority, local authorities or other local support providers

Market Traders, Operators and Service Users

Bristol City Council will use your information to process your eligibility for a Markets license or use of service.

Living Wage City

The service engages with employers across Bristol to encourage and support them to gain Living Wage Accreditation.

Will my personal data be sent outside the UK?

Personal information

Our legal bases for using your personal information are to exercise our tasks in the public interest.

We are collecting this data under:

- Local Government Act 2003, Business Improvement Districts (England) Regulations 2004.
- The legal gateway for this processing activity is The Local Government (Promotion of Economic Development) Regulations 1990 (legislation.gov.uk).

Our additional legal basis for using your information is Legitimate interest in order to:

- Help prestart up, start up, sole trader, micro, small and medium (SME) businesses including social enterprises based in target wards within Bristol to establish and prepare for growth.
- To provide regular business emails which include comprehensive business news, updates, and information.
- Help Businesses operating between 6pm-6am in the city of Bristol to access business support and training to enable them to operate safely, securely and efficiently during those hours.
- Help individuals working in the city of Bristol between 6pm-6am to access training, support and guidance to work safely and understand their rights.
- Help individuals visiting the city of Bristol during 6pm-6am to provide them with guidance of where to go and what is available and doing so safely.
- Bristol City Council will use your information to process your eligibility for a Markets license or use of service.
- The service engages with employers across Bristol to encourage and support them to gain Living Wage Accreditation.



How long we will keep your personal information?

We will hold this information for as long as it is needed, or if we are required to do so by law. In practice this means that your personal information may be retained for the relevant period listed below:

- Business Improvement Districts/Business Rates: Will be held for 6 years.
- Business Newsletter: Will be held for 1 year or as long as the business is subscribed.
- Invest Bristol and Bath (IBB): Will be held for 6 years.
- Bristol Business and Enterprise Support (BrisBES): Will be held for 10 years or as long as the business is trading.
- Bristol Nights: Will be held for 6 years or as long as the business is trading.
- **High Streets:** Will be held for 6 years or as long as the business is trading.
- Market Traders, Operators and Service Users: Will be held for 6 years or as long as the business is trading.
- Living Wage City: Will be held for 6 years or as long as the business is trading.

Your rights as a data subject
