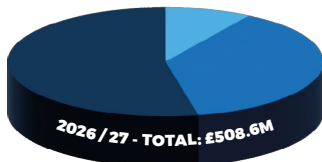


The police and crime precept that forms part of your council tax will help to fund policing in your area.

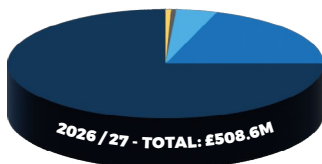
