You are forbidden (whether by yourselves or by instructing or encouraging any other person) **FROM:**

- i. Entering or being present, within the area shown in the Map attached to this injunction edged and hatched red or green, on Clifton Down, Durdham Down and Ladies Mile with the intention of residing in any tent, structure, caravan, van, or vehicle.
- ii. Defecating and/or urinating, other than in the public toilets, within the area shown in the Map attached to this Injunction edged and hatched red and green.
- iii. Placing household or any other waste material within the area shown in the Map attached to this Injunction edged and hatched red or green. For the avoidance of doubt, this prohibits the use of the public bins.
- iv. Causing any nuisance, harassment, alarm or distress to any person lawfully on Durdham Down, Clifton Down and Ladies Mile by way of any or all of (1) dangerous driving of any vehicle, (2) verbal or physical abuse or threats, (3) unreasonable levels of noise, (4) allowing any animal to be out of control and/or, (5) disposing of waste except in a manner expressly permitted in writing by Bristol City Council.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT you must vacate any part of the area shown in the Map attached to the Injunction edged and hatched red or green on Clifton Down, Durdham Down and Ladies Mile within two hours of any written or oral request by an authorised officer or agent of Bristol City Council or by any constable (provided

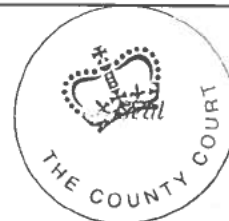

This power of arrest was ordered on 25 July 2025 and expires on 25 July 2026 at 23.59 hours or further order.

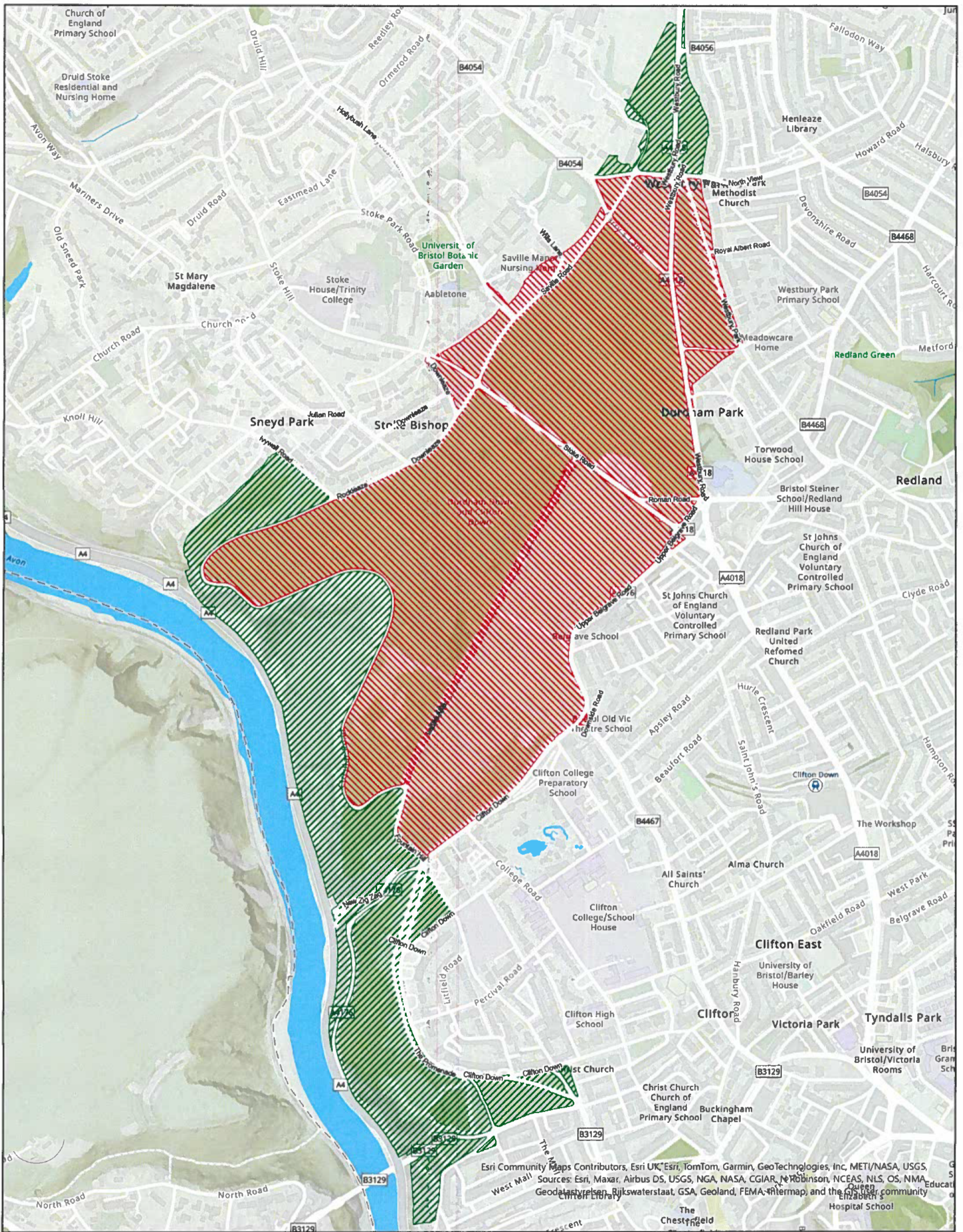

 - b. What provisions of the injunction he disagrees with and why?
 - c. If any, what alternative order he thinks should be granted to the Claimant

AND UPON ██████████ not attending

AND UPON reading the witness statements of Caroline Ennion and Althia Stephens

AND UPON ██████████ emailing the Claimant and the Court at 13.48 on 5 December 2025 and making a request to adjourn today's hearing.

AND UPON the Court considering ██████████ representations and deciding that it is not necessary to adjourn the hearing because the reasons he puts forward for an adjournment are not relevant to the question of whether he should be joined as a defendant and for the injunction to be reviewed

AND UPON the Claimant's Solicitor submitting that ██████████ application be dismissed having regard to the points made in the witness statements of Caroline Ennion and Althia Stephens.

AND UPON the Court having received an unissued application from the Bristol Housing Action Movement and finding that it is totally without merit as it is seeking to change a judgment already issued which is properly an appeal for which there is no permission.

AND UPON the Claimant's Solicitor informing the Court that it is the Claimant's intention to request that the Court extend the Injunction to include all of the roads around The Downs and to extend the duration of the Injunction to 31 December 2026.

IT IS ORDERED THAT

1. The request to adjourn from ██████████ is refused.
2. The applications by ██████████ to be joined as a defendant and to review the main injunction are dismissed.
3. The unissued application by the 'Bristol Housing Action Movement' is dismissed as totally without merit.
4. The Claimant's request for a further review hearing to consider any application made to extend the ambit of the Injunction is granted.

AND UPON hearing representations regarding these proceedings from [REDACTED] on behalf of Protect the Downs and [REDACTED] on behalf of Bristol Housing Action Movement.

AND UPON the Court reading the witness statement of Kurt James dated 04.02.2026 and the exhibits thereto.

AND UPON the Claimant having issued proceedings on 04.02.2026 to vary the Injunction in these proceedings to include the following roads (Parrys Lane, Saville Road, Clay Pit Road, Westbury Park, Rockleaze, Downleaze, Roman Road, Stoke Road, Wills Lane and Circular Road) ('the Roads')

AND UPON the Claimant also having issued separate proceedings in respect of trespass onto those roads.

AND UPON the Claimant's solicitor indication that the Claimant's proposed course of action was to seek a possession order under CPR 55 in respect of the roads, and then if granted, to serve any varied Injunction to prevent further trespass or other anti-social conduct in future.

AND UPON the Claimant's Solicitor seeking directions in relation to service of both sets of proceedings, and the Court agreeing to that course of action and giving directions as set out below.

AND UPON the Court indicating that the Claimant needed to amend its Statement of Case in Claim no: M00BS959 to fully particularise its causes of action, and that the Statement of Case in the possession proceedings should also be sufficiently particularised.

AND UPON [REDACTED] making representations that the potential to be subject to an order for costs was a deterrent to persons affected by these proceedings from effectively participating in them.

AND UPON the Court confirming this was not a case in which, of its own motion, a cost capping order would be imposed

BUT UPON the Claimant's solicitor agreeing to take instructions from the Claimant as to the extent to which (if at all) the Claimant would seek costs against any unsuccessful Defendant or participant.

IT IS ORDERED THAT

1. The claim is consolidated with case N00BS117 with M00BS959 being the lead case.
2. The claims are allocated to the fast track and assigned to complexity band 4.
3. The Claimant shall amend its statement of case in Claim No. M00BS959 to more properly particularise the causes of action and the grounds on which further injunctive relief is sought
4. The amended statement of case, and any further evidence upon which the Claimant relies in that claim, must be filed and served by 4pm on 26 February 2026.
5. The Claimant's possession claim in respect of the Roads must also be served by 4pm on 26 February 2026.
6. Service of both sets of proceedings shall be effected in the following ways
 - i. Notice of the proceedings will be attached to a number of prominent locations around the Downs as indicated on a map which is to be approved by District Judge Napier. No application is required.
 - ii. The wording of the notice must be approved by District Judge Napier. No application is required.
 - iii. Each notice will be accompanied with a QR code linking to the Claimant's website on which the Claimant must maintain:
 1. The statements of case
 2. The orders of the Court
 3. The judgment of the Court granting the current injunction (or by linking to it on BAILII)
 4. Any evidence which the Claimant has filed and served in the proceedings
 - iv. Copies of the Statements of Case and evidence in both claims will be served on St Mungos (charity) and the offices of the Bristol Housing Action Movement or such other address as [REDACTED] may specify.
7. Any person applying to join the proceedings as a defendant must make an application in Form N244 and file and serve any evidence on which they intend to rely by 4pm 20 March 2026 in the form of a witness statement.
8. The claim for possession in Claim No. N00BS177 and the application to vary the Injunction in Claim no: M00BS959 shall be listed for an attended trial on 16 and 17 April 2026 at Bristol Civil Justice Centre, 2 Redcliff Street, Redcliffe, Bristol BS1 6GR.
9. The informal request for a costs capping order is refused.
10. The costs of today in Claim No: M00BS959 shall be costs in the case.
11. There shall be no order as to costs in Claim No: N00BS177 in respect of the hearing today.
