

NCMP Privacy Notice

Who we are

Bristol City Council is the data controller for the purposes of the Data Protection Act 2018 and other regulations including the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR), which means it determines what your personal data is used for and why it is collected.

The purpose of this privacy notice is to tell you about how we collect and use personal data in connection with our service. We may update this privacy notice from time to time. When we do this, we will communicate any changes to you and publish the revised privacy notice on our website. This privacy notice should be read alongside the councils [Corporate Privacy Notice](#).

National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP)

The [National Child Measurement Programme](#) (NCMP) is a system of childhood growth surveillance for reception and year 6 age children in England. It is a mandatory duty of public health in local authorities to conduct this work and share information with NHS England who collate national statistics from the data collected by each local authority. The programme is lead nationally by the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) and NHS England and must be conducted locally in accordance with the guidance created by NHS England.

What data we need to collect and use?

To provide this service, we will collect and use some or all the personal information below:

- Pupils' Full Name
- Pupils' unique pupil number & school ID number
- Pupils' Address (including postcode)
- Pupils' Date of Birth
- Pupils' Parent/Carer Contact details (including telephone number & email address)
- Pupils' Ethnicity
- Pupils' Gender
- Height
- Weight

- Date measured
- BMI centile and change

We get most of this information from you and from what we learn about you through your use of our services, but we may also get some information about you from:

- **Sirona care & health**

How do we use your personal information?

We use this information for one or more of the following reasons:

We will use this information for our statutory duty to submit this data annually to NHS England, via a web-based system they provide. The data is also used to make telephone calls and generate personalised feedback letters to parents and carers based on the specific measurements of their child. Record level data used for a wide variety of analyses of the prevalence of excess weight / obesity, cross referenced via postcode of residence to a number of other local geographies (deprivation quintiles, children's centre catchments, school pupil catchments, wards, etc.)

Important: Your child will **not be identified** in any published statistics or reports

What is the legal basis for our use of your personal information?

The information below shows the legal bases we are relying on to use your personal or special category (sensitive) personal information.

Special category (sensitive) personal information

Our additional legal bases for using your special category information are:

- substantial public interest for the provision of:
 - health or social care
 - public health where the processing is necessary for:
 - public health monitoring and statistics.

Who else might we share your personal information with?

Sometimes we may need to share your information, but we will only do so where we have a valid legal basis to share data. We will only share the minimum information for each circumstance. We may share some of your personal information with one or more of the following:

- Data is shared with: **NHS England**, and **The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC)**, where appropriate

How long we will keep your personal information?

We will hold this information for as long as it is needed, or if we are required to do so by law. In practice this means that your personal information may be retained for the relevant period listed below:

- We will hold this information from the start of the programme (2006) for twenty years. The period of time that we will hold this data for will facilitate trend analysis, and to resolve parent/carers queries relating to previous years of the programme.
- After this, your personal information will be pseudonymised and archived.

Your rights as a data subject

The law gives you a number of rights to control what and how personal information is used by us, including the right to access a copy of your personal information and withdraw your consent when we rely on your permission to use your personal data.
