With crowds of consumers there are insufficient facilities for waste. Streets off Chandos Road suffer from littering, partly due to the high density of HMOs. The entire area has only one small bin which is almost permanently overflowing. We are asking for six upgraded waste bins like those found in the city centre to improve public hygiene and pest control. The pavements are narrow and often blocked. The public space is cluttered. There is no facility for cycle storage; cycles are often tied to trees, railings and lampposts, causing obstruction. These issues reduce accessibility for pedestrians. To facilitate use and enjoyment by the many elderly and disabled residents plus parents with small children, we request enhancement of public space with seats and planters.
