RALEIGH ROAD AREA, PROHIBITIONS OF LEFT TURN, PROHIBITIONS OF ENTRY, WAITING RESTRICTIONS AND PARKING PLACES - TRAFFIC ORDERS

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE it proposes to make the following traffic orders to regulate vehicles in the Southville Collection development, which will be located at the former Amerind Grove Nursing Home site:-

- A. **Ref No. CAE/RGW/P-1364A** – the City Council of Bristol (Cavendish Street, Elmtree Road and Raleigh Road, Bedminster and Southville Wards, City of Bristol) (Prohibition of Left Turn) (Prohibition of Entry) Order 202-, the effect of which would be:-
1. to prohibit any vehicle proceeding in **Raleigh Road** from entering **Cavendish Street** or **Elmtree Road**; and
 2. to introduce prohibited left turns from **Cavendish Street** or **Elmtree Road** into **Raleigh Road**.
- B. **Ref No. CAE/RGW/P-1364B** – the City Council of Bristol (Southville Area, Bedminster and Southville Wards, City of Bristol) (Residents' Parking Area) (On-Street Parking Places) (Prohibition of Waiting and Stopping) Order 202-, the effect of which would be:-
1. to replace Monday to Saturday 9am to 5pm shared use permit parking and/or (3 hours maximum stay) pay and display parking places in **Greenway Bush Lane** and **Raleigh Road** with prohibitions of waiting at any time; and
 2. to revise Monday to Saturday 9am to 5pm permit parking places in **Raleigh Road**.
