



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION

SECTION 23 PEDESTRIAN CROSSING



NOTICE is hereby given that the City Council of Bristol in exercise of powers conferred by section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, and after consultation with the chief officer of police, intends to:-

1. **remove** the following push button controlled (puffin) crossing in the City of Bristol:

LOCATION	Number of Crossings
Across Hotwell Road (Hotwells & Harbourside ward) east of its junction with Dock Gate Lane.	1 (puffin)

2. **install** the following push button controlled (toucan) crossing in the in the same location as the crossings proposed to be removed City of Bristol.

LOCATION	Number of Crossings
Across Hotwell Road (Hotwells & Harbourside ward) east of its junction with Dock Gate Lane. (Plan: SN-26-001P-09)	1 (toucan)

3. **install** the following push button controlled unsegregated (toucan) crossing for pedestrians and cyclists in the City of Bristol

LOCATION	Number of Crossings
Across Hotwell Road (Clifton ward) east of its junction with Clifton Vale. (Plan: SN-26-001P-10)	1 (toucan)
Across Hotwell Road (Hotwells & Harbourside ward) west of its junction with Rownham Mead. (Plan: SN-26-001P-10)	1 (toucan)
Across Merchants Road (Hotwells & Harbourside ward) south-east of its junction with Hotwells Road. (Plan: SN-26-001P-10)	1 (toucan)
