

Community Consultation: Tree planting at Clifton Vale Flats, Clifton (BS8 4PX)

One Tree Per Child have designed a draft tree planting plan for 20 specimen trees at Clifton Vale flats to improve the current green space. These include a small, flowering magnolia avenue, small cornelian cherries, small birches for dappled shade, a small mixed hedge and two flowering judas trees.

We are now undertaking a community consultation, please see map overleaf. Posters will be up at the site and can also be viewed at www.bristol.gov.uk/onetreeperchild.

Suitable tree planting locations have been selected throughout the area with “**the right tree in the right place**” principle, carefully considering each tree planting location and appropriate tree type. Funding for tree planting is provided as part of a financial contribution made by developers to support local environment enhancements. Tree planting is planned for this planting season, by the end of the Spring.
