NOTICE is hereby given that the City Council of Bristol in exercise of powers conferred by section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, and after consultation with the Chief officer of Police, intends to install the following uncontrolled (zebra) crossing in the City of Bristol:-

Across Marsh Street (Central ward) north of its junction with Broad Quay and Prince Street	1 (zebra)
