Bristol Green Walk

Bristol Green Walk is a 7 mile (11km) route following public rights of way between Clifton Suspension Bridge and Penpole Lane, Shirehampton. The walk takes in some of Bristol's most beautiful and historic green spaces, with plenty of things to see and do along the way.

Starting at Brunel's famous Clifton Suspension Bridge spanning the Avon Gorge, the route crosses Clifton and Durdham Downs, goes along Hollybush Lane past the University's Botanic Gardens, then through the parkland of Stoke Lodge and via the Trym valley to the Blaise estate (with its museum, castle folly and Iron Age fort) and the Kingsweston estate (both of which are mentioned as excursion destinations in Jane Austen novels). The route ends at Penpole Point which has been a popular vantage point overlooking the Severn for generations.
