

Community Consultation:

Tree planting in Mile Walk, Robinia Walk, Hengrove and Whitchurch

One Tree Per Child have designed a draft tree planting plan for 16 new trees for Mile Walk, Robinia Walk in Hengrove and Whitchurch.

We are now undertaking a community consultation, please see map overleaf. Posters will be up at the site and can also be viewed at www.bristol.gov.uk/onetreeperchild.

Suitable tree planting locations have been selected throughout the area with “**the right tree in the right place**” principle, carefully considering each tree planting location and appropriate tree type. Tree planting is planned for this planting season by the end of the Spring.
