

Tree planting plan for Mawdeley House and Warden Road, Southville (BS3 1XA)

A draft tree planting plan for 3 specimen trees was created to help improve the current green space for residents. The consultation was circulated to residents, displayed in locations in the area and was added to the consultation page on the Bristol City Council website.

Below is a summary of the comments received; Bristol City Council's response; and any revisions to the plan where appropriate.

Comment	Response
Too many trees already/ species comment – Mawdeley House resident	The proposed location for the specimen tree is in an area where there are no existing trees, noting the site covers nearly half an acre. It will provide shade and visual flowering impact near the bin area. The proposed tree is a Magnolia grandiflora 'Little Gem' (not an option in the key on the map) - a smaller variety of magnolia.
Lack of maintenance - Mawdeley House	The trees will be under a period of establishment maintenance where they will be watered regularly and mulched. Once established, the trees will be managed within the Council's tree maintenance programme and Tree Management Policies. They are regularly inspected and maintained as required, based on risk assessment.
A note of Non-native species	Species selection considers our changing climate and the effects of our drought. Planting non-natives helps build a more resilient tree stock through drought tolerance and disease resistance. They can be used in combination with both new and existing native trees to future proof our city's tree canopy.

Tree plan revisions:

What happens next:

Tree planting will take place in the next planting season, December to March.

The trees will be under a period of establishment maintenance. They will be watered and checked weekly over the spring/ summer in year one and fortnightly in year two. Once established, the trees will be managed within the Council's tree maintenance programme and Tree Management Policies.
