There are 32 technicians among the 229 on the list of those waiting to dig, and 21 civil servants, local government officers and clerks.

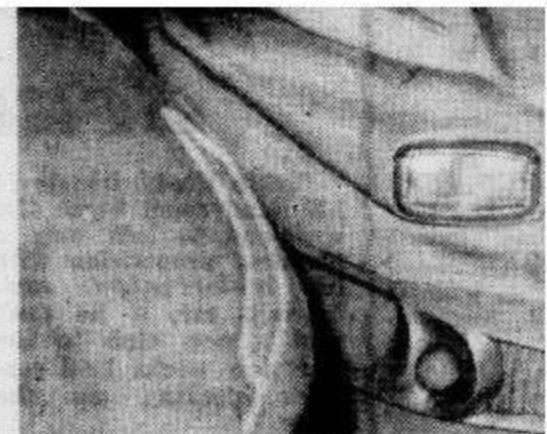
Nor is demand confined to the male sex. There are 14 housewives who want their own allotments.
