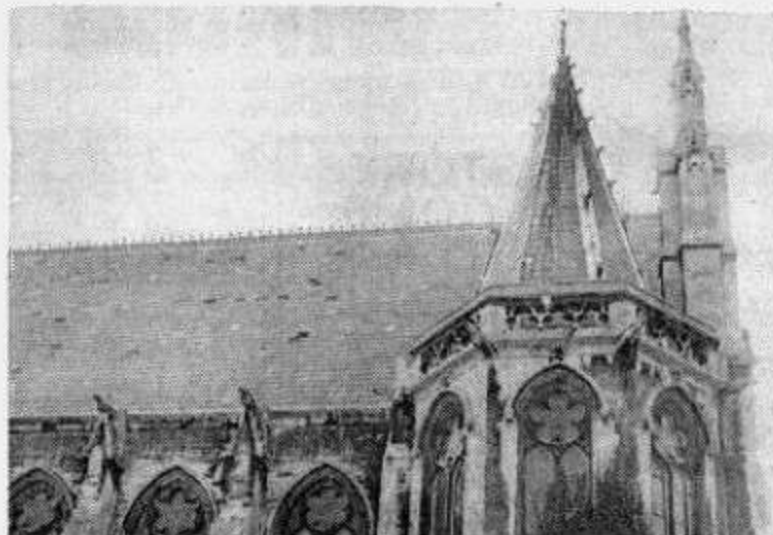

Warning to dog owners

PEOPLE walking their dogs at Stoke Lodge playing fields, Bristol, have been told by Avon county council that they are not welcome.

Complaints have been sent to councillors, claiming that "no dogs" notices were being ignored and that the land was being spoilt by dog droppings.

Avon county council spokesman Pat Daniells said: "There are no by-laws covering the fields.

"If people were to take the names and addresses of owners concerned, we would write reminding them that people with dogs are not welcome."

Killer hunt widens

BRISTOL'S Euro MP, Mr Richard Cottrell, will fly to Greece next month to press on with his inquiries into the death of Ann Chapman, the British journalist murdered in Greece in 1971.

"I have been given the names of people, many of them policemen, who may have information relevant to the death," he said today.

He has been appointed by the European Parliament to draw up a report on the murder of Miss Chapman, aged 25, who had working as a freelance for BBC Radio London.

The dead girl's parents

have maintained that she was killed by the Greek junta because she was on to a big story.

Mr Cottrell is convinced that Nikolas Moundis, the Greek convicted of her murder but since recommended for a pardon, was not guilty.

Golden haul

A 95-year-old widow was robbed of 68 gold sovereigns worth £5,000 by conmen who talked their way into her home in Eccleshall, Sheffield, claiming they were checking water and electricity supplies.

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
