The improved web offering would need to include frequently asked questions which are relevant to the specific needs for people with protected characteristics such as enquiries about dropped kerbs, pedestrian crossings, shared use paths etc. There needs to be provision for additional priority to be given to handling a case because the enquiry has a protected characteristic. For example a parent with a visual impairment would need to be able to explain why she or he has difficulties with crossings around schools which may not be shared by other parents who can see.

If the web site is developed in conjunction with people with protected characteristics then it could benefit Citizens who can access/consume the relevant information in a self-service manner limiting the need to spend time/money contacting the Council. The web site would need to be transactional, to enable people with protected characteristics to get a response, or change the way a highway is designed. The website will need to be accessible for people using differing software and for people with minimal English.

There is a risk that highway design may inadvertently create disadvantage for people with a protected characteristic. It is vital that the council can respond to any instance of discrimination or potential discrimination. Digital only services could have a negative impact on people whom we know cannot access digital services, elderly people and people with learning difficulties. Therefore provision needs to be made for these people

to be able to access information about highways and to report concerns.
