Equalities Profile Bangladeshis living in Bristol

1.0 Population in Bristol

The 2011 Census shows that there were 2,104 people stating their ethnic group as Bangladeshi living in Bristol in 2011. Bangladeshis account for 0.5% of the total population of Bristol, an increase from 2001 when there were 1,230 (0.3%) Bangladeshi people usually resident in Bristol.





Figure 2: Bangladeshi population by ward

Most Bangladeshis live in central and north eastern Bristol. The wards with the highest population of Bangladeshis are Lawrence Hill, Easton and Eastville, followed by Lockleaze, Hillfields and Frome Vale (see Figure 2). These six wards combined are home to 61% of all Bangladeshis living in Bristol.

The Census can tell us where the Bangladeshi population living in Bristol were born. Half (51%) of Bangladeshis living in Bristol were born in the UK and almost half (47%) were born in South Asia. In total there were 1,039 people born in Bangladesh and 983 people whose main language was Bengali (with Sylheti and Chatgaya).



The age profile of the Bangladeshi population living in Bristol is much younger than that of the population as a whole – 81% of Bangladeshis living in Bristol are aged under 40 compared to 60% of the total population. In particular, there is a large proportion of children – 35.7% of all Bangladeshis are aged under 16, compared to the Bristol average 18.4%. Less than 3% of Bangladeshis are aged 65 and over compared to 13% of the total population.

In terms of religion, 87.5% of Bangladeshis are Muslim.


3.0 Work

Economic activity

Economic activity levels of Bangladeshis living in Bristol are similar to those of the population as a whole. Two thirds (63.3%) of Bangladeshis aged 16 and over are economically active (ie either in employment or unemployed but looking for work) compared to the Bristol average of 65.2%. Although economic inactivity levels are similar to the city average, rather than being mainly retired people, this is mainly due to the proportion of people who are looking after their home or family – 13.7% of Bangladeshis aged 16 and over are looking after their home or family, this is significantly higher than the Bristol average of 3.6%.

Of those Bangladeshis in employment as an employee, a higher proportion work part time (20.8%) than the city average (12.4%). The proportion of Bangladeshis who are self-employed is slightly higher than the Bristol average -9.9% compared to the Bristol average of 7.8%.

Qualifications

Bangladeshis have lower qualification levels than the population as a whole. Almost a fifth (19.1%) of Bangladeshis aged 16 and over have a degree or higher compared to a third (32.8%) of all people aged 16 and over. A higher proportion of Bangladeshis aged 16 and over have no qualifications compared to the Bristol average – 27.3% compared to 20.2% average for the population as a whole. A large proportion (16.1%) of Bangladeshis however have qualifications which are not directly equivalent to UK qualification categories.




Figure 5: Highest and lowest levels of qualification of people aged 16 and over Source: 2011 Census ONS Crown Copyright Reserved [from Nomis on 5 June 2013]

Socio-economic classification

Bangladeshis have a lower proportion of people in managerial, professional and intermediate occupations (21.4%) than the city average (43.8%) but a higher proportion of small employers and own account workers – 10.1% compared to Bristol average 7%. 17.9% of Bangladeshis have never worked or are long-term unemployed (Bristol average 5.5%).

Half of all Bangladeshis are employed in just two sectors – 35% in accommodation and food services and 16.9% in wholesale and retail trade.

4.0 Housing

Like the population as a whole, the majority of Bangladeshis (74.4%) live in houses rather than flats or temporary accommodation (25.6%). Less than half of Bangladeshis own their own home – 46.1% compared to the city average of 55.5%. Consequently higher proportions (34.3%) rent from a social provider (ie local authority or housing association) than the city average (19.6%). A lower proportion (19.6%) of Bangladeshis rent privately or live rent free than the city average (24.9%).

Occupancy ratings provide a measure of whether a household's accommodation is overcrowded or under occupied. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household has one fewer bedrooms than required, whereas +1 implies that they have one more room/bedroom than the standard requirement. Overcrowding is an issue for the Bangladeshi community with more than a third (37.2%) of Bangladeshis living in households with fewer bedrooms than required compared to the Bristol average of 9.5% of people.

Car ownership levels are similar to the city average with 79% of Bangladeshis having access to at least one car in their household.
