Proposed variation to premises licence:

The variation application submitted is to vary the premises licence conditions as per the following:

REMOVE:

1. Live music shall take place indoors and shall be limited to a maximum of two performers and to entertainment at bona fide private events.
2. Recorded music shall take place indoors and shall consist of the playing of all descriptions of amplified recorded music.
3. Similar entertainment shall take place indoors and shall consist of live entertainment and karaoke.
4. Facilities for dancing shall take place indoors.
5. Provision of late-night refreshment shall take place indoors.
6. Under 18-year-olds shall not be allowed to play on Section 34 AWP machines.
7. Children will not be permitted to purchase anything at the bar counter
8. When children are allowed upon the premises, any entertainment offered within the premises shall be suitable for young persons.
9. Children shall be required to be supervised by the accompanying adult at all times.
10. Soft drinks and non-alcoholic drinks shall be available at all times.
11. A recognised proof of age policy shall be enforced.
12. Embedded condition -Licensing Act 1964 [section 59, 60, 63, 67A, 68, 70, 74, 76] Intoxicating Liquor shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means those as listed on page one of this licence, except that:
 - a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10 a.m. to 11 p.m.
 - b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
 - c. On Good Friday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
 - d. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
 - e. On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.
 - f. On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
 - g. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the Intoxicating Liquor on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the Intoxicating Liquor from the premises unless the Intoxicating Liquor is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the Intoxicating Liquor on the premises by persons taking meals there if the Intoxicating Liquor was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) the sale or supply to, or consumption by, any person of intoxicating liquor, who is residing in the premises;
- (e) the ordering of Intoxicating Liquor to be consumed off the premises, or the

despatch by the vendor of the Intoxicating Liquor so ordered;

(f) the sale of Intoxicating Liquor to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;

(g) the sale or supply of Intoxicating Liquor to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of Intoxicating Liquor is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

(h) the taking of Intoxicating Liquor from the premises by a person residing there; or

(i) the supply of Intoxicating Liquor for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of Intoxicating Liquor by persons so supplied; or

(j) the supply of Intoxicating Liquor for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

13. The condition reproduces the effect of The Children and Young Persons Act 1933 (para 6(8) of Schedule 8 Licensing Act 2003 and para 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 Transitional Provisions Order 2005 SI 2005/40. Notwithstanding that by virtue of the Licensing Act 2003 certain provisions of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 have ceased to have effect in England and Wales, in so far as any U) the supply of Intoxicating Liquor for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

14. There shall be a further 30-minute wind down period after the permitted supply of alcohol terminates.

15. Where appropriate, non-alcoholic refreshment shall be available in the period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises.

16. The premises shall respect Spirit Group's 'Approach to Responsible Drinking', ref: M6179, dated December 2004 (a copy of which has been deposited with the licensing office).

17. Door Staff shall be SIA approved and operate in accordance with the security industry guidelines.

18. A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs shall be enforced at all times.

19. If a disc jockey is used on any night then he/she shall remind customers to leave quietly.

20. All incidences of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police and shall be kept in an incident log book.

21. Public safety is integral to the way that the Spirit Group runs its business and is reviewed regularly through the company's health and safety policy. This policy is fully briefed and trained to all management and staff and the company shall continue to train staff to the standards required by relevant legislation.

22. Additional patrols shall take place by members of staff, internally and externally, to limit any noise pollution when regulated entertainment is taking place within the premises.

23. Signs shall be prominently displayed at the premises at all points where customers leave the building requesting them to respect local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.

24. Where already used text/radio pagers shall continue to be used for the additional hours of trading and shall be monitored by a responsible member of staff.

25. When children are allowed upon the premises, any entertainment offered within the premises shall be suitable for young persons.

26. Children shall be required to be supervised by the accompanying adult at all

times.

REPLACE WITH:

1. (i). CCTV must be in use at the premises
- (ii) The CCTV equipment must be maintained in good working order and continually record when licensable activity takes place and for a period of two hours afterwards.
- (iii) The premises licence holder shall ensure images from the CCTV are retained for a period of 31 days. This image retention period may be reviewed as appropriate by the Licensing Authority
- (iv) The correct time and date will be generated onto both the recording and the real time image screen.
- (v) If the CCTV equipment breaks down the Premises Licence Holder shall ensure the designated premises supervisor, or in his/her absence other responsible person, verbally informs the Licensing Authority and the Police as soon as is reasonably practicable. This information shall be contemporaneously recorded in the incident report register and shall include the time, date and means this was done and to whom the information was reported. Equipment failures shall be repaired or replaced as soon as is reasonably practicable and without undue delay. The Licensing Authority and the Police shall be informed when faults are rectified.
- (vi) The premises Licence holder must ensure that there are trained members of staff available during licensable hours to be able to reproduce and download CCTV images into a format at the request of an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable.
- (vii) There must be clear signage indicating that CCTV equipment is in use and recording at the premises during all opening hours.
2. The CCTV system must include the external areas of the premises.
3. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult after 20:00.
4. The premises licence holder must ensure that a clearly visible notice will be placed on the premises advising those attending, that the Police will be informed if anyone is found in possession of controlled substances or weapons.
5. The external area shall only be open to customers until 23:00 daily. Adequate notices shall be displayed in appropriate locations to ensure that this information is brought to the attention of patrons.
6. The premises licence holder shall ensure that all drinking glasses used within the premises are of toughened or safety glass to the appropriate safety standard, in that they shall not produce sharp shards when broken.
7. A clear notice shall be displayed at any exit to the premises to instruct customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.
8. Drugs and weapons seized will be placed in a locked receptacle set aside for this purpose. The means for securing or unlocking the receptacle will be retained by the premises licence holder or the designated premises supervisor or in their absence any other responsible person. A record shall be made of the seizure, the time, date and by whom, and to whom the items were handed on to in a bound book specifically kept for that purpose. Such a book to be produced to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable upon request. The premises licence holder shall make suitable arrangements with the Police for the collection of any seized items.
9. Subject to reasonable notice being given which save in an emergency shall be not less than seven days, the premises licence holder shall ensure attendance at any meeting convened by the Police to discuss any matters relating to the premises.
10. All staff to be trained in the prevention of underage sales to a level commensurate with their duties. All such training to be updated as necessary, for instance when legislation changes, and should include training on how to deal with difficult customers. The training should be clearly digitally documented and signed and dated by both the trainer and the member of staff receiving it. The digital documentation

shall be available for inspection on request by an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable.

11. (a) An approved proof of age scheme shall be adopted, implemented and advertised within the premise such as "Challenge 25" whereby an accepted form of photographic identification shall be requested before any alcohol is sold to any person who appears to be under 25 years of age. Acceptable proof of age shall include identification bearing the customers photograph, date of birth and integral holographic mark or security measure. Suitable means of identification would include PASS approved proof of age card, photo-card driving licence and passport.

(b) Publicity materials notifying customers of the operation of the Challenge 25 scheme shall be displayed at the premises, including a Challenge 25 sign of at least A5 size at the entrance to the premises and where practicable at each point of sale.

12. The premises licence holder shall require the designated premises supervisor, or in his/her absence other responsible person, to keep a digital incident/refusals logbook in which full details of all incidents are recorded. This shall include details of any refused sales and shall give details of the persons involved, incident description, time and date, actions taken and final outcome of the situation. This shall be completed as soon as possible and in any case no later than the close of business on the day of the incident. The time and date when the report was completed, and by whom, is to form part of the entry. The digital logbook is to be retained at all times and shall be produced or made available to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable when required.

13. The premises shall not be permitted to be used for any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children, which prohibited uses include, among other things, nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups or any relevant entertainment (with the meaning of the third schedule to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 except where that is expressly permitted under a licence or waiver granted or given under that legislation.

14. No external speakers for amplification of music or speech to be used outside of the premises after 23:00.

15. There shall be no entry or re-entry to the premises after 23:30 except to smoke. Appropriate signage shall be clearly displayed at each exit from the premises advising patrons that re-entry to the premises after 2330 hours is prohibited.

16. The need for SIA security guards shall be assessed by the licence holder / designated premises supervisor on a regular basis and security guards shall be employed when and where the assessment requires.

When the risk assessment deems that SIA door staff are employed the following conditions shall apply-

17. Door supervisors who have been approved by the Security Industry Authority or any accreditation scheme recognised by the Licensing Authority, shall be used to vet customers, and maintain public order.

18. [A] The premises licence holder shall ensure that the following details for each door supervisor, are contemporaneously entered into a bound or digital register kept for that purpose:

(i) Full name,

(ii) SIA Certificate number and or badge number, or registration number of any accreditation scheme recognised by the Licensing Authority (including expiry date of that registration or accreditation),

(iii) The time they began their duty

(iv) The time they completed their duty.

This register is to be kept at the premises at all times and shall be so maintained as to enable an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable to establish

the particulars of all door stewards engaged at the premises during the period of not less than 31 days prior to the request and shall be open to inspection by authorised officers of the Licensing Authority or a constable upon request.

[B] The premises licence holder shall ensure that the following details for each door supervisor are entered into a bound or digital register kept for that purpose to include the following details:

- (i) Name
- (ii) Date of birth
- (iii) Address
- (iv) Contact telephone numbers
- (v) SIA Certificate number, or registration number of any accreditation scheme recognised by the Licensing Authority.
- (vi) Commencement date of performing duties at the premises.
- (vii) The full details of any agency through which they have been allocated to work at the premises if appropriate. These details should be easily accessible to any authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable.

19. The premises licence holder shall ensure that all door supervisors on duty at the premises wear a current identification badge, issued by the Security Industry Authority or any accreditation scheme recognised by the Licensing Authority, in a conspicuous position to the front of their upper body.

20. All door supervisors shall be capable of communicating instantly with one another by way of radio or other simultaneous system of communication.

21. All door supervisors shall wear distinctive clothing or insignia to clearly identify them as door supervisors. Door supervisors on duty at the front door shall wear some form of 'high visibility' clothing (such as a jacket or waistcoat).
