Positive trends:

- Citizen engagement was driven this month by One City, WeAreBristol, The Architecture Centre, UWE Bristol, Magnet School Project, Wildscreen Festival, Voscur, Age UK, Bristol Housing Festival and Break the Cycle
- The news that, through local partnerships, free school meals would be available to children in the city got strong cut through with the Mayor's announcement leading this. Sentiment from local citizens appreciated the mayor "stepping up" to the challenge, despite no support from central government. This topic spiked
- The mayor's comment that "We can't tell the full British story unless we tell the story of Black people within that story." as well as various initiatives and appearances for Black History Month had cut through

- Celebrity architect George Clarke's visit alongside MR to the site of the proposed Lockleaze development built on the city's affordable housing narrative. As did the

Negative trends:


