Positive trends:


- Citizen engagement was driven this month by; #BPNConversations, ACH, #IGConf2019, Begbrook Academy, #ISLC2019 and the #bigtidy initiatives
- Positivity about the Mayor's record especially on race and equality continues to resonate with citizens
- Bristol Waste's GetItSorted recycling campaign received good traction and sharing across the city
- The Mayor's welcoming of HMS Prince of Wales to its affiliated home in the city
- The mayor's efforts and position on climate change continues to draw positive comments, boosted this month by the #ClimateActionCoBenefits conference
- Positive response to the Mayor's intervention in response to a campaign from a local resident to stop cuts to bus services in the city
- The Mayor's visit to families' new council homes in Broomhill and Brislington
- Some cut through for the Small Business Saturdays initiative


Negative trends:

- The Mayor's comments about local democracy reporter and journalist were widely shared with many members of local media and online activists rounding to defend him. A lot of the posts claimed that the mayor's comments were childish with a smaller number suggesting it was bullying behaviour
- Political opponents and education 'activists' have piled in on the current administration's record on SEND and the Mayor's comments after a recent OFSTED inspection
- The background noise and disgruntlement about various developments in the city continues, with little changing in terms of the nature of complaints
- Negativity about spending remains largely fragmented, although Bristol Energy and spending on feasibility studies were common themes in December
- There remains some scepticism on the mayor's record, but most of this was blow back from the Mayor's own 'delivering for Bristol' message
- Accusations of double standards related to the council's purchase of diesel vans in light of the upcoming diesel ban, although these did not catch on in any major way








