



Allocation Statement for Ashley Down Primary School - September 2019

As Ashley Down Primary School was oversubscribed, the criteria stated in the booklet 'A Guide for parents and carers on applying for a primary school place for the school year 2019-2020' have been applied to allocate the places that are available at the school.

199 on-time applications (*63 x 1st preferences, 83 x 2nd preferences, 53 x 3rd preferences*) have been received for Ashley Down Primary School, which has an Admission Number of **60**.

How the Initial Allocation of Places was made

ALLOCATION STATEMENT FOR ENTRY TO RECEPTION 2019

Following the outcome of secondary school places on National Offer Day on April 16th, **45** applicants were included on the waiting list. This included those who requested to go on the waiting list, those who changed their preferences and those who applied late (applications received after 15th January 2019 were not included in the first round).

All reception places were offered in accordance with the CPS admission arrangements 2019/20 and as part of the coordinated admissions scheme with Bristol City Council. The waiting list was re ranked against the admissions criteria, in order of priority, as well as a fresh round of random allocation. Remaining unsuccessful applicants were drawn randomly and placed on to the waiting list.

Why has my child been unsuccessful in gaining a place at the school?

CPS had 3 places to re offer. 1 place was offered to a child who qualified as a 'Looked after' child' or 'previously looked after' child and the 2 remaining places were offered by random allocation.

How have the 60 places been allocated for Reception September 2019?

The Special Educational Needs team at Bristol City Council have not requested any places are reserved for children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

The 60 places have been allocated as follows;

- 'Looked after' children or 'previously looked after' children - 2 places
- Siblings - 32 places.
- Son/daughter of CPS member of staff - none.
- Random allocation - 26 places.



Appeals will be arranged by the Clifton Diocesan Department for Schools and Colleges and conducted in accordance with the Code of Practice on School Appeals. The result of the appeal is binding on all parties.

- Prepare your case.

An appeals panel can only uphold an appeal in these circumstances if

(b) It was unreasonable to turn your child down given circumstances.

The Law defines 'unreasonable' as being completely illogical, or not based on the facts of the case.

95 on-time applications (*26 x 1st preferences, 49 x 2nd preferences, 20 x 3rd preferences*) have been received for Wansdyke Primary School, which has an Admission Number of 30.

How the Initial Allocation of Places was made

The **30** places have been offered to the following children:

1. Children in the care of the Local Authority or who were previously in Care but immediately after being in Care became subject to an adoption order, child arrangement order or special guardianship order (**1** place)
2. Those children with siblings already at Wansdyke Primary School and who will still be there in September 2019. (**7** places)
3. Those children living closest to Wansdyke Primary School as measured in a direct line from the home address to the school. (**22** places)

The furthest distance offered a place in this category was **2.234 km**.
