
Thank you for viewing this exhibition.

This is the first of a series of events to give residents and businesses an opportunity to have their say and find out more information about the residential-led development of Hengrove Park and Hartcliffe Campus.

A project team has been appointed to work with the council on the first stage of the preferred delivery approach for the development. This involves securing outline planning consents and a masterplan for each site that will establish the design quality, quantum and type of housing and open space requirements. The council will then select developers who can bring forward detailed plans for specific areas in line with the outline consents.



Understanding the history of the area is an important part of the site analysis

From 1930-1957, the site was used as Bristol's principle airfield, prior to its relocation in 1957 to its current position. It was one of the few airports to maintain civil flights to Lisbon and Shannon during World War II. A section of the runway remains on the site today.

Following its closure in 1957, the airfield was re-opened in 1959 as Whitchurch Circuit, a car racing circuit holding Formula Two and Formula Three races.

By 2012 the first phase of significant new development had been completed at Hengrove Park. Focusing on providing new community facilities, the site is now served by Hengrove Leisure Centre, South Bristol Community Hospital and South Bristol Skills Academy.






