Filwood Broadway Framework

We worked in partnership with local residents and stakeholders to produce the Framework. This has been endorsed by local residents, the Neighbourhood leaders and the Council Cabinet.

Lawrence Weston College Site

W produced a development brief in partnership with the Lawrence Weston Neighbourhood Planning Group and Neighbourhood Partnership. Community involvement tools included a walkabout and an interactive model at the wider community event.

St Paul's Park

This award winning community space resulted from a collaborative design approach. Local people, the police and the City Council were all involved.

We supported residents to produce a vision document that ensures good development. The Council has endorsed the vision and the government has given Neighbourhood Forum status to the local planning group.
