2016-17 project highlights:

- 3957 trees planted with primary-aged children and volunteers in parks, woodlands, school grounds and open spaces
- 1945 free fruit trees planted in pupils gardens and school grounds
- 4 new community woodlands planted city wide
- Core Lead Volunteer group established
- 3 volunteer practical events carried out per week throughout the planting season, including 16 maintenance days
- Partner lead volunteer maintenance events on woodland sites planted 2015 – 2016

2. Education highlights:

- 132 schools engaged with project
- All Bristol's Year 5 classes involved in tree based education workshop
- Six school bake-off competitions – The Crumble Rumble held at Ashton Court
- 21 planting events involving school children in schools and local green spaces, with 887 children taking part

4. OneTree Per Child Bristol planting events November 2016 – March 2017 highlights:

- 5 school grounds planting events, planting 823 trees
- 29 community planting events, planting 2861 trees
- 887 children involved in planting events
- 1945 free fruit trees planted in pupils gardens and school grounds
- 4 community orchard planting events, planting 48 trees
- 16 community maintenance day

The community planting events engaged the local primary schools as part of the One Tree Per Child Bristol program in addition to individuals, community and corporate groups.

5. Volunteer programme

The OTPC Lead Volunteer training programme was launched in Summer 2015 to recruit, train and engage volunteers in our winter planting season, with the aim of encouraging longer term engagement in tree maintenance across the city. This training programme was continued into 2016 – 2017.

Highlights:

- 8 volunteer training days run in partnership with the TCV and local tree experts. These included both practical and class room based training events
- 23 people were trained in a comprehensive overview of the tree planting process from initial design and consultation to planting
- 8 key corporate volunteer groups engaged in planting events – Skanska, Soil Association, HSBC, Radisson Blu, Nation Wide, Jewsons, Sole Vison and Arcadis
- TCV maintained woodland sites planted in partnership in the 2015-2016 season
- The two UWE WOW weeks in February attracted 43 volunteers, 32 of which were UWE students
