(ST. PAULS AREA, ASHLEY WARD, CITY OF BRISTOL) (RESIDENTS' PARKING AREA) (ON-STREET PARKING PLACES) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND STOPPING) ORDER 202-

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE it proposes to make a traffic order, the effect of which would be:-

1. to replace the Car Club parking place and 9 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday shared use permit parking and/or pay and display (max stay 3 hours) parking in the northern end of **Tudor Road**, east side, with 9 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday permit parking and prohibition of waiting at any time;
2. to replace the Mon – Fri 8 am – 6 pm loading place and a section of 9 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday permit parking in the northern end of **Tudor Road**, west side, with prohibition of waiting at any time;
3. to replace a length of 9 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday permit parking in **Cairns Crescent**, north east side, with prohibition of waiting at any time;
4. to remove a length of prohibition of waiting at any time in the north western end of **Drummond Road**, north east side;
5. to introduce a disabled persons' parking place in the Monday to Friday 9 am to 5 pm permit parking area in **Morgan Street**, south east side (removing the permit parking provision in that length in the process); and
6. to introduce disabled persons' parking places in place of existing lengths of 9 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday permit parking in **Byron Street, Campbell Street, Cave Street, Dalrymple Road, London Road, Thomas Street** and **William Street**.
