

September 2023 first round allocation statement for Oasis Academy John Williams

As Oasis Academy John Williams was oversubscribed, the admissions criteria published on the Academy and Local Authority websites have been applied to allocate the places that are available at the Academy.

Number of applications received

541 on-time applications (237 first preferences, 190 second preferences and 114 third preferences) have been received for Oasis Academy John Williams which has a published admission number of 180.

4 places were required for children with the school named in their Education, Health and Care Plan.

This left 176 places to allocate using the published criteria.

How the initial allocation of places was made

The 176 places have been offered to the following children:

1. Those children who are defined as Children in Care or children who were previously in care but immediately after being in care became subject to an adoption, child arrangements or special guardianship order. (0 places)
2. Those children with siblings who will be members of years 7 to 11 at the Academy on the date when the applicant would be admitted. (51 places)
3. Those children who live within the area of first priority for Oasis Academy John Williams, who live closest to the Academy as measured in a direct line from the home address to the Academy. (125 places)

The furthest distance offered a place under this criteria was 1.692 km.

Second round allocation statement for Oasis Academy John Williams

From April 11th 20 places had become available at Oasis Academy John Williams for reallocation. A total of 65 applicants were wanting to be considered so it was necessary to apply the published admissions criteria to determine who could be offered the places at the Academy.

The 20 places were offered to:

1. Those children who are defined as Children in Care or children who were previously in care but immediately after being in care became subject to an adoption, child arrangements or special guardianship order. (0 places)
2. Those children with siblings who will be members of years 7 to 11 at the Academy on the date when the applicant would be admitted. (1 place)
3. Those children who live within the area of first priority for Oasis Academy John Williams, who live closest to the Academy as measured in a direct line from the home address to the Academy. (5 places)
4. Those children who live outside the area of first priority for Oasis Academy John Williams, who live closest to the Academy as measured in a direct line from the home address to the Academy. (14 places)

The furthest distance offered a place under this criteria was 1.604 km.
