





People's Voice Project – What happens next

The People's Project – what is it?

The People's Voice project is part of the Bristol Impact Fund. At the moment there is no organisation in Bristol for people with Learning Difficulties which is led by people with Learning Difficulties.

The Bristol Impact Fund set aside some of its money to fund some research to find out if People with Learning Difficulties wanted their own organisation. This research has now happened and the answer is: they do want an organisation (see the Background document attached to this Expression of Interest).

The next step is to identify an organisation in Bristol which can use the remaining funding (£150,000) to support People with learning difficulties to create this new organisation which they lead themselves.

It will be an organisation which brings people with Learning Difficulties together, supports them to take action on things that are important to them and strengthens their voice and influence in the city.

What is Bristol Impact Fund?

The goal of Bristol Impact Fund (BIF) is to grow the power of communities that experience the greatest inequality. By this we mean communities living in a the city's deprived neighbourhoods and communities with shared history of discrimination and prejudice (equalities communities).

The fund will support people to come together in their communities, make strong connections and take action on the issues that matter most to them. We know that some communities have less power in the city. These include working class communities, Black, Asian, and ethnic minority communities, Younger people, Older people, Lesbian, Gay and Bisexual people, Transgender people, Women, some faith groups and Disabled people.

These communities need the space, resources, and support to get their voices heard and make changes happen.

Bristol Impact Fund has seven principles at the heart of their work:

- **Equitable**: This means to take action to address unfairness.

- **Inclusive:** This means to find respectful, creative ways to include people and communities who are often left out from community and city life.
- Asset-based: This means taking the time to discover, then build on, the strengths that are already in the community. Assets are people – their interests, time, experience, skills, networks, community and voluntary groups. Assets are also money, buildings, land, the local corner shop, nursery, sheltered housing, businesses and services.
- Place-based: This means to encourage many more people to come together and make life better in their local area
- **Build relationship:** This means to link people with other people, to make "Nothing About Us Without Us" a way of working.
- Citizen-led: This means People-Power: support people to take actions for themselves.
- Nurturing the community and voluntary sector ecosystem: Different groups and organisations work together well, they are 'stronger together'. Work to support groups that work with people who experience discrimination and prejudice.

People's Voice Project - What happens next

Step 1 – Expression of Interest

An Expression of Interest is you telling the Council that you want to receive this money, why you want it and what you want to do with it.

We are inviting organisations to apply for a grant of £169,000 for two and a quarter years (27 months – from July 2023 to September 2025).

This grant is open to organisations led and controlled by Disabled People OR organisations with a track record supporting the voice and power of Disabled People with Learning Difficulties (traditionally known as people with Learning Difficulties and Disabilities).

We are inviting applicants who want to find out more about the Expression of Interest and People's Voice Project to join an online information session on the Tuesday 30th May 2023 13:00 -14:00.

There are **2 stages** to the application:

 Stage 1 - Applicants fill in an expression of interest form (below), giving contact details, information about their organisation, telling us what they want to do with the grant and confirming that they are one of the right types of organisation that is allowed to receive the grant (eligible applicant).

Applicants can submit expressions of interest any time between 22nd May 2023 up to 5.00pm on Thursday 8th June 2023 by email to investmentandgrants@bristol.gov.uk.

Stage 2 – Eligible applicants will be invited to attend a 20 minute interview to share their idea or proposal with a small group of council people and People's Voice project workers on the Tuesday 13th of June 2023 between 11:00am and 13:00pm.

Applicants can decide how to share their idea using a verbal or visual presentation (for example: a film, a round-table discussion, informal chat

or whatever suits them best). If you bring a presentation or film, it should be no longer than five minutes.

We will let you know on the **afternoon of the 12th of June 2023** if we want to interview you on the **13th of June 2023**.

The interviews will be held at <u>City Hall (Bristol)</u>. A laptop, projector and flip chart will be available at every session, if you think that you will need additional equipment, please let us know.

We will let organisations know which one we are giving the grant to as soon as possible after the interview.

Baseline Standards
