



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION
ACT 1984
SECTION 23 PEDESTRIAN CROSSING



NOTICE is hereby given that the City Council of Bristol in exercise of powers conferred by section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, and after consultation with the chief officer of police, intends to:

1. **Install** the following uncontrolled (zebra) crossings in the City of Bristol:-

<u>Location</u>	<u>No. of Crossings</u>
Across West Town Lane (Stockwood ward) west of its junction with Sturminster Road	1 (zebra)
Across West Town Lane (Stockwood ward) north-east of its junction with Sturminster Road	1 (zebra)
Across Sturminster Road (Stockwood ward) south of its junction with West Town Lane	1 (zebra)
Across Sturminster Road (Stockwood ward) between its junctions with Beechwood Close and Manston Close	1 (zebra)
Across West Town Lane (Stockwood ward) west of its junction with Hazelbury Road	1 (zebra)

2. **Remove** the following uncontrolled (Zebra) crossing in the City of Bristol:-

Across West Town Lane (Stockwood ward) west of its junction with Sturminster Road	1 (zebra)
