

Summary of public comments:

Draft tree planting plan for The Tump

November 2023

A draft tree planting plan was circulated to residents and displayed in locations on the street. In addition, it was added to the consultation page on the Bristol City Council website and the Friends of Group were given the opportunity to comment.

Thank you to everyone for your comments. However unfortunately in this instance, upon further detailed analysis of site, it is not possible to progress tree planting in this area.

We have responded to the comments as received below with more detail as a point of record.

What happens next?

Comments received: We have given these comments consideration and provide responses below:

Existing trees in this area need to be maintained	All existing trees owned by Bristol City Council are regularly surveyed. I have passed your concerns to the appropriate team.
How many trees are proposed?	300 woodland trees were proposed for this area, all woodland trees are planted with a 2m spacing.
What species are proposed?	This would have been a mixed, native woodland with species including Hazel, Hawthorn and Crab Apple.
Historic tree replacement would be more in-keeping with the current management plan.	We will pursue this option for future planting seasons.
