**NORTH ROAD AND OVERTON ROAD, ASHLEY WARD, WAITING
PROHIBITIONS, PARKING PLACES AND PROHIBITION OF DRIVING
- TRAFFIC ORDERS**

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE it proposes to make the following traffic orders:-

A. **Ref No. CAE/RGW/P-1289A** – the City Council of Bristol (North Road and Overton Road, Ashley Ward, City of Bristol) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Disabled Persons' Parking Places) (Loading Places) Order 202-, the effect of which would be:-

1. to introduce a loading place in **North Road**;
2. to introduce a disabled persons' parking place in **North Road**;
3. to introduce prohibition of waiting for vehicles in **North Road** and **Overton Road**;
and
4. to introduce prohibition of loading/unloading for vehicles in **North Road** and **Overton Road**.

B. **Ref No. CAE/RGW/P-1289B** – the City Council of Bristol (Overton Road, Ashley Ward, City of Bristol) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 20--, the effect of which would be:-

1. to prohibit any motor vehicle from entering or proceeding in **Overton Road** between Gloucester Road and North Road subject to specified exemptions for vehicles being used by statutory undertakers and/or for statutory purposes and emergency services;
and
2. to remove the one way traffic working in a westerly direction in the above length of **Overton Road**.

The Council is satisfied that the prohibition of driving provision proposed should operate for more than 8 hours in any period of 24 hours for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road to which the order relates or any other road, or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.
