ST. PETERS WAY AREA, HORFIELD WARD SPEED LIMIT AND TRAFFIC ORDERS

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE it proposes to make the following orders:-

- A. **Ref No. CAE/NMT/P-1276A** - City Council of Bristol (St. Peters Way, Horfield Ward, City of Bristol) (De-Restriction) (20 Mph Speed Limit) Order 202-, the effect of which would be to introduce a 20 mph speed limit in newly-constructed **St. Peters Way** in place of the 30 mph speed limit it would otherwise acquire due to the presence of a system of street lighting which would impose restricted road status.
- B. **Ref No. CAE/NMT/P-1276B** - City Council of Bristol (St. Peters Way, Horfield Ward, City of Bristol) (One Way Traffic and Contraflow Cycling) Order 202-, the effect of which would be:-
- (i) to introduce westbound thence southbound one way traffic working in newly-constructed **St. Peters Way**, and
 - (ii) to permit contraflow cycling for pedal cycles against the one way traffic.
- C. **Ref No. CAE/NMT/P-1276C** - City Council of Bristol (Various Roads, Southmead Hospital Area, Horfield, Southmead, and Westbury-on-Trym and Henleaze Wards, City of Bristol) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Car Club Parking Places) Order 202-, the effect of which would be:-
- (i) to introduce prohibition of waiting arrangements for vehicles in lengths of newly-constructed **St. Peters Way**;
 - (ii) to revise prohibition of waiting arrangements for vehicles in **Bishopthorpe Road** and **Maskelyne Avenue** – the City Council of Bristol (Various Roads, Southmead Hospital Area, Horfield, Southmead, and Westbury-on-Trym and Henleaze Wards, City of Bristol) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Car Club Parking Places) (Part 1) Order 2016 would be revoked and all other provisions within brought forward into the new order unamended, and;
 - (iii) to revise the regulation of the existing no stopping on school keep clear markings in **Ascot Road, Bishop Manor Road, Doncaster Road, Kendon Drive, Luckington Road** and **Stanton Road** by introducing provision into the proposed order so that the traffic signs on-site can be enforced.

Note: Temporary traffic measures are currently in operation on-site in lengths of **Bishopthorpe Road** and **Maskelyne Avenue** by virtue of the City Council of Bristol (Bishopthorpe Road and Maskelyne Avenue, Horfield, Bristol) (Temporary Prohibition of Use by Vehicles and Foot Passengers) (Temporary Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2023 in connection with the St. Peters House development.
