

Allocation Statement for St Peter's Church of England VC Primary School - September 2024

As St Peter's Church of England VC Primary School was oversubscribed, the criteria stated in their published admissions policy available on the school and Local Authority websites have been applied to allocate the places that are available at the school.

142 on-time applications (66 x 1st preferences, 52 x 2nd preferences, 24 x 3rd preferences) have been received for St Peter's Church of England VC Primary School, which has an Admission Number of 60.

How the Initial Allocation of Places was made

The 60 places have been offered to the following children:

1. Children in the care of the Local Authority or who were previously in Care but immediately after being in Care became subject to an adoption order, child arrangement order or special guardianship order. (2 places)
2. Those children with siblings already at St Peter's Church of England VC Primary School and who will still be there in September 2024. (27 places)
3. Those children living closest to St Peter's Church of England VC Primary School as measured in a direct line from the home address to the school. (31 places)

The furthest distance offered a place in this category was 1.166 km.

Second Round Allocation

As at 24th May 2024 2 places became available at the school for reallocation. There were 7 wanting to be considered.

The 2 places have been offered to the following children:

1. Children in the care of the Local Authority or who were previously in Care but immediately after being in Care became subject to an adoption order, child arrangement order or special guardianship order. (1 place)
2. Those children with siblings already at St Peter's Church of England VC Primary School and who will still be there in September 2024. (1 place)

The furthest distance offered a place in this category was 0.485 km.

Infant class size prejudice appeals - effects of infant Class Size legislation.

Appeals for St Peter's Church of England VC Primary School will be heard on the basis of infant class size prejudice as the school will have two Reception classes each containing 30 pupils.
