(JOHN STREET AND MOGG STREET, ASHLEY WARD, CITY OF BRISTOL)
(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) (MOGG STREET, ASHLEY WARD, CITY OF BRISTOL) (ONE WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 202-

The City Council of Bristol hereby gives NOTICE that it intends to make a traffic order, the effect of which would be:-

1. to prohibit any vehicle from entering or proceeding in:-

(a) **John Street**; or

(b) **Mogg Street**, between James Street and Cleave Street –

between the hours of 8.30 am and 9.15 am and the hours of 2.45 pm and 3.30 pm on Monday to Friday. The closures would operate during St. Werburgh's Primary School term days only; and

2. to introduce south eastwards one way traffic in **Mogg Street** from James Street to Cleave Street.

Exemption to the prohibition of driving provisions would be provided for pedal cycles, blue badge holders, for specified/statutory purposes and for permit holders. Permits would be issued at the discretion of the Council. Exemption to the one way provision would be provided for pedal cycles.
